Canada's Jordan Cheyne wins inaugural "Course des Coeurs" Bike Race

The Unionville Sports Council (USC) has announced the Results of their inaugural "Course des Coeurs" Unionville Race of the Hearts Bike and Foot Race. The day's weather turned out to be just perfect as over 170 runners and 130 cyclists raced in order to promote physical activity, and also to remember the life of Brianne Carter, who was a student at the Charles F. Patton Middle School.

The days' events could not have occurred without the sponsorship of many, including CWR Electronics and Scott Honda. In addition, the support and help of over 80 volunteers made the races safe and organized. The Kennett Paper called it a "stunning success".

The bike race was the first USA Cycling sanctioned event in Southern Chester County, and saw racers from Canada and 5 different states participate. Featured racers included Mark Walters, the winner of the 2003 Philadelphia International Cycling Championship, and the reigning National Time Trail Champion, Jonathan Chodroff, of Kennett Square.

After having survived over 2 hours on racing in the beautiful West Marlborough country side, Jordan Cheyne, a 17 year old up and coming Canadian finished in 1st Place in the Pro 1/2 race. Racing for the Main Line Cycling - BiKyle/Mazu Team, Jordan finished the race in 2:21:26.

The 11th running of the Run for Brianne was also held at the same time. Duncan Smith was the winner of the 10K in a time of 43:58. Tim Christopher was the inner of the 5K in a time of 21:31.
